

Tips for Hanging Artwork at the Creekside Barn

Tools

- Spackling paste and knife
 - Tape measure
 - Hammer
 - Hooks
 - Paper and pencil to jot down heights
 - Calculator
 - Level
 - Double sided adhesive pads
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Prep Wall

Remove previous artwork, hooks, information cards and pads. Fill holes with spackle.

Determine Arrangement

Arrange artwork on the floor, leaning against the wall, to determine the most pleasing display. Try to balance size, visual weight, colors, etc. to come up with the best arrangement. Sometimes two small pieces can be stacked.

Determine Hook Placement

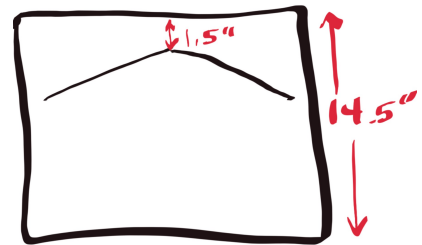
The center of each piece should be 60" from the floor. To determine where to put the hook, use this formula:

$(H / 2) - D + 60 = \text{placement for bottom of hook}$

H = height of frame, rounded to 1/2"

D = distance from wire to top of frame

Example: $(14.5 / 2) - 1.5 + 60 = 65.75"$



Hang Artwork

It is helpful to begin by hanging the piece in the center and work outward. This way you can make sure the distance between pieces is consistent.

Once the artwork up, check that each piece is level. There are small levels in the tool bag. Then place a double sided pad at the base of each piece to hold it level.

Place the information card for each piece on the wall using double sided pads. Under the piece on the right side seems to work well.
